ISSA Mining to Participate in WMC 2011, Turkey

ISSA Mining's president Theodor Bülhoff and Secretary-general Helmut Ehnes tied important contacts with representatives of Turkey's coal mining industry and government during a fully packed visit to Turkey in July. Discussions with important stakeholders in Turkey's capital Ankara and in Zonguldak in the Black Sea region, an important port because of coal mining, led the way into a promising future cooperation for the benefit of Turkish miners and the industry as well.

Trapped Miners in Chile: ISSA Mining Contributes Expertise

On August 5, 2010, the roof of the San José copper-gold mine north of Copiapó, Chile collapsed, leaving 33 miners trapped underground at approximately 700 metres (2,300 ft.). Rescue efforts started on August 6. A second collapse occurred on August 7 when rescuers were trying to gain access via a ventilation shaft.

The Chile Chamber of Commerce contacted BG RCI's mine Rescue Team (Germany), a member of ISSA Mining, seeking advice one week after the incident. BG RCI/ISSA Mining helped with information, established contacts to members of the IMRB network on the American continent as well as to a German supplier of high precision directional drilling equipment, and shared expertise basing on various mine rescue efforts such as in Lengede and Stolzenbach (Germany) as well as Lassing (Austria). BG RCI's mine Rescue Team also offered to supply the "Dahlbusch rescue capsule", a device firstly utilized in the Lengede incident, where eleven trapped men have been rescued from a depth of 58 meters in such a device.

Cooperation with SAWS, China

Together with ISSA's Secretary-general Hans-Horst Konkolewsky, ISSA Mining met with Executive Director General Bai Ran, and Director Wang Qinghua, representatives of the State Administration of Work Safety (SAWS), agreeing on a sustainable cooperation in the non-coal mining sector over the next years.

Subsequently, ISSA Mining discussed matters of mine safety and rescue at the China operation of Dräger, one of the biggest suppliers for mining safety equipment. Dräger operates a local plant with 120 employees, producing quality sensors and respiratory protective devices, currently being extended.

Seminar on Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) in the Mining Industry – Eskisehir, Turkey, 21 - 22 October 2010

ISSA Mining will contribute to a workshop organised by the Technical Assistance Information Exchange Instrument of the European Commission (TAIEX) in co-operation with the Turkish Ministry of Labour and Social Security General Directorate of Occupational Health and Safety.

The aim of the project is to provide relevant information about the occupational health and safety conditions in the mining industry in order to contribute to the improvement of working conditions in this sector. The mining industry in Turkey has a high number of occupational accidents: between 1955 and 2009, more than 2000 employees lost their lives and more than 300,000 employees were injured.

ISSA Mining Experts Christian van den Berg and Wolfgang Roehl will discuss health surveillance of employees, the proper design and maintenance of coalmines, and a new solution for using a long-term respiratory protective device in vehicles.

Ontario Mine Rescue Competition

Porcupine Gold Mine rescue team, Canada, wins competition

Fire fighting skills, expertise in rope rescue, and ability with lifting bags had to be proven by the competing mine rescue teams in the Hollinger Gold Mine during the 60th annual Ontario Mine Rescue Competition in Timmins in June. But that has not been everything: When an “unexpected” mine emergency occurred, teams had to shift from demonstration mode to rescue mode. Goldcorp Canada’s Porcupine Gold Mine rescue team achieved the best results and won the competition, next to the 2010 Fire fighting Team Award.

Vast potentials and risk evaluation: ISSA symposium “Nanotechnology” 4. and 5. October 2010, KKL, Lucerne, Switzerland

The increasing significance of nanotechnology is presenting new challenges for occupational health and safety.

This symposium, which is organised by the Chemistry Section of the ISSA, highlights the opportunities nanotechnology offers for industry and medicine as well as the risks it poses. It provides information on future legal regulations on a national and international level.

For example, the current developments and/or goals of nanotechnology include:

- The further miniaturisation of semiconductor electronics and optoelectronics and the development of innovative materials in industrial production processes, e.g. nano tubes.
- The development of new diagnostics and treatments in medicine (e.g. contrast agents for imaging techniques in computer tomography or magnetic resonance tomography as

well as new drugs containing nanoparticles to transport or store active ingredients, e.g. for the treatment of tumours).

- Improvement of self-cleaning processes for surfaces. Numerous applications are also used to solve everyday problems, e.g. the lotus effect.
- Nanotechnology is currently being used as corrosion protection for car bodywork. In this case, a nanoscale binding agent is used as an alternative to chromate layers during the spraying process.
- Protection against UV radiation in modern sun creams is provided by nanoscale titanium dioxide.
