# REACHING AND PROTECTING THE DIFFICULT-TO-COVER GROUPS

Despite important progress in a number of countries, bridging the coverage gap remains a top priority. With large parts of formal sector workers now being covered, and cash transfers and subsidies being introduced to reduce poverty, the attention has shifted to workers that are difficult to cover due the specific characteristics of their work and income. A highlight of the Forum, the World Social Security Summit will bring together high-level representatives of governments and international organizations to discuss strategies that protect people against evolving risks, not least in the context of a changing world of work and remaining coverage gaps. The Summit will consider the key role of political commitment and institutional capacities to ensure that social security leaves no one behind, contributes to social cohesion and supports inclusive growth strategies.

A special programme for the World Social Security Summit including all distinguished participants of the Summit will be made available during the World Social Security Forum.


